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## BANNER HEALTH COVID-19 RESPONSE

#### March 24, 2020

Banner Health is evaluating the COVID-19 response and prevention measures daily to protect employees and patients. This remains a very fluid situation and material is subject to change.

Please see important updates from Banner Health leadership below.

- Social comfort masking: While Banner Health doesn't endorse personal mask use in preventing disease transmission, they recognize that personnel may want to engage
  in 'social comfort masking'. Personnel may now wear social comfort masks, but remain required to follow Banner's PPE protocol. See attached PDF for further information.
- COVID-19 specimen collection sites: Banner Health has opened COVID-19 specimen collection drive-through locations for the public. Those with concerns about <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> or exposure can now call Banner Health at 1-844-549-1851 to speak with a clinical team member to determine if testing is appropriate. The line is staffed from 7 a.m. 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. 5 p.m. on Friday. If an individual meets CDC criteria for testing, they will be scheduled for an appointment at one of the drive-through sites located in the Phoenix metropolitan area and in Tucson.
- Emergency Department outside triaging ongoing at Tucson and South campuses: To maintain the integrity of the ED waiting room and hospital buildings, Banner Health continues to screen ED patients in outside designated triage areas, from 10 a.m.-9 p.m. Outside of those hours patients will use the normal ED entrance. This is normal ED screening, not COVID-19 testing.
- Social distancing: The physician and resident lounges will now comply by limiting seating to 10.
- Boys and Girls Club of Tucson's Frank & Edith Morton Clubhouse is currently holding 50 spots at no cost for Banner Health employees' children ages 5-17 until further notice. These spots are first come, first served. The program runs 8 a.m.-6 p.m., at 3155 E. Grant Rd. Tucson, Ariz., with breakfast and lunch provided. - YMCA extended their spring break camp (through the and of March) for ages 5-12. Registration is online only. Please email foryouth@tucsonymca.org for assistance.

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## BANNER HEALTH COVID-19 RESPONSE

#### March 19, 2020

Banner Health is evaluating the COVID-19 response and prevention measures daily to protect employees and patients. This remains a very fluid situation and material is subject to change.

Please see important updates from Banner Health leadership below.

Entrance restrictions may require extra time:

- · Tucson Campus: All staff must use the cafeteria patio door.
- · South Campus: All staff must use the front entrance or the Behavioral Health Pavilion entrance.
- · North Campus: All staff must use the front entrance. All patients and visitors entering North Campus are being screened before entering the facility.

#### Until further notice:

- Arrival for work: Upon entry, Banner employees and affiliated team members are required to show their Banner badge at a check-in table. By entering the building, team
  members are attesting that they are: fever free and not experiencing symptoms including cough, runny nose, sneezing, sore throat, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting or shortness
  of breath not related to other health conditions such as allergies or chronic illness.
- No visitors allowed in hospitals. These are unprecedented times, please stress to patients that Banner Health is taking this very rare action to help ensure their safety as well as the safety of their loved ones, caregivers and community members. Exceptions: pediatric patients (under the age of 18) may have one adult visitor; and laboring mothers may have one support person.
- Emergency Department triaging at Tucson and South campuses: ED patients are being screened in a designated tented area outside and waiting in their cars before
  coming into the hospital to maintain the integrity of the ED waiting room and hospital buildings. This is normal ED screening, not COVID-19 testing.
- · Wellness Center and gift shops are closed.
- · Cafeterias are open for Banner employees only; access requires a Banner badge. Food is pick up only.
- PPE usage and supply are constantly monitored.
- Work from home is in place for those who can.
